American Jail Association Resolution End-of-Life Care in Local Detention Facilities

WHEREAS, with the changes in sentencing laws, there is a growing number of elderly and terminally ill inmates in

local detention systems,

WHEREAS, a number of correctional/detention systems along with recognized experts are studying and trying to

improve end-of-life care, and

WHEREAS, the ultimate goal is to achieve quality hospice care, specialized education and training for detention

personnel, as well as effective care of the seriously and chronically ill as they approach the end of life;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED

THAT the American Jail Association encourage legislatures and the judiciary to develop mechanisms for the

release of terminally ill inmates from confinement who do not pose a risk to public safety, and

THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER

RESOLVED THAT the American Jail Association urge all detention systems to take steps to address the needs of this

population in a way that respects human dignity.
